

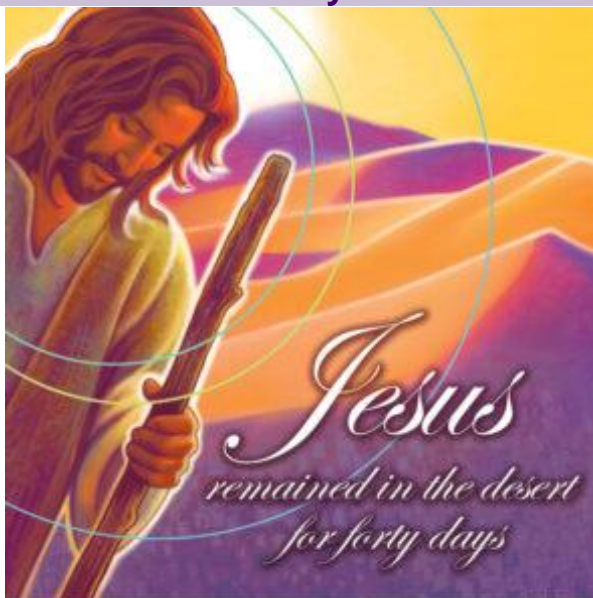

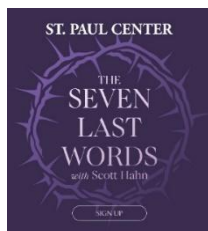
Season Four of the Chosen (ZOOM)

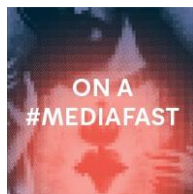

ON THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they also look to the present and the future, and give us an insight into our own relationship with God.

March is dedicated to Saint Joseph, the spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the foster-father of Jesus

March 8 – **Saint John of God**, Religious, founded the Order of Charity and the Order of the Brothers Hospitallers of Saint John of God, Patron of hospitals, nurses and sick people, booksellers, printers, heart patients, firefighters

March 8 – INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY

A focal point in the women's rights movement, bringing attention to issues such as gender equality, reproductive rights, and violence and abuse against women.

March 12-14-15 – Lenten Ember Days, Spring Embertide

Days of fasting and abstinence, prayer and penance, where, stressing spiritual renewal, we thank God for the sacraments and pray for priests. We offer prayers for the needs of all people, for the productivity of the earth and for human labour; we thank God for the gifts of nature and are reminded to make use of these in moderation, and to assist the needy. Lenten ember days are specifically ordered to ask for blessings on the upcoming growing season, and are offered in thanksgiving with flowers, which feed the bees, who make the wax, that gives us the altar candles, symbolized by the Paschal and baptismal candle, ultimately bring us the gift of light

March 9 – **Saint Frances of Rome**, mother, widow, Benedictine Religious, foundress of the *Oblates of the Tor de' Specchi* (Collatines), Patroness of widows, drivers

March 9 – **Saint Dominic Savio**, blessed with spiritual gifts far beyond his age – knowledge of people in need, knowledge of the spiritual needs of those around him, and the ability to prophesy, Patron of choirs, choirboys, boys, and juvenile delinquents

March 10 – **Saint John Ogilvie**, convert, Jesuit, only officially Scottish Martyr

March 10 -19 – NOVENA TO SAINT JOSEPH

March 14 – **Saint Matilda**, Queen of Germany, founded Benedictine abbeys, well known for her generosity, teaching, comforting the sick, and visiting prisoners, Patron of: death of children, disappointing children, falsely accused people, large families, people ridiculed for their piety, queens, second marriages, widows
