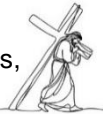

ON THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they also look to the present and the future, and give us an insight into our own relationship with God.

March is dedicated to Saint Joseph, the spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the foster-father of Jesus. No words of his are recorded in the Gospels; he was the “silent” man, visited by angels in his dreams.

March 2 – **SHROVE (Quinquagesima / Cheese-fare / Forgiveness) SUNDAY**

The seventh Sunday before Easter and the last before Ash Wednesday & Lent, the last day that Orthodox Christians traditionally eat dairy products until Easter

March 4 – **Saint Casimir**, Polish Prince, Grand-Duke of Lithuania, lived a highly disciplined, virtuous, even severe life, life amid the dissolute court, Patron of Lithuania and one of the patrons of Poland

March 4 – **Saint Non (Nonna, Nonnita)**, [unwed] mother of Saint David, Patron of religious in convents in Wales, Cornwall, and Brittany

March 7 – **Saints Perpetua and Felicity**, noblewoman & her slave, martyred as pregnant catechumens the persecution of Christians by Emperor Severus

Friday, March 7 – **DAY OF PRAYER FOR SURVIVORS AND VICTIMS OF SEXUAL ABUSE**, on the first Friday of Lent, blessed candles are lit in parishes as a reminder to the faithful of the need for atonement and to symbolise repentance, light in the darkness and hope for those who’ve suffered

Friday, March 7 – **WORLD DAY OF ECUMENICAL PRAYER**

On the first Friday in March, Christians are invited to pause and pray together ecumenically, recalling our Christian responsibility to be sensitive to the signs of the times so that we might bring a more authentically Christian dimension to the concerns of our world, our country, our community. 
LENT – INFORMATION & RESOURCES

March 4 – MARDI GRAS / SHROVE TUESDAY / “Fat Tuesday”




In times of greater Lenten austerity in Catholic countries, Mardi Gras offered an opportunity for households to consume some foods they would not enjoy until Easter. In England, the day has been celebrated with pancakes (which use eggs, milk and sugar – items some people would have foregone during Lent), while in some areas of Germany the Lenten discipline applied to strong drink as well, so the day before Ash Wednesday became a time for special revelry.

Certain cities around the world have become identified with elaborate festivities leading up to Mardi Gras, usually known as “Carnival” (“Farewell to Meat”).

 For the Church, fasting is consuming a single strong meal a day , plus 2 small meals that together do not exceed the main meal in quantity.	You cannot eat meat: beef, pork, chicken, lamb. You can eat fish, shellfish and (although it may sound strange) lizards.

March 5 – ASH WEDNESDAY

Beginning the season of Lent, Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence. The Ashes used to mark the beginning of Lent the following year come from the branches that were blessed and distributed the previous Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord.

Lent has two major purposes: 1) it recalls or prepares for our Baptism and Confirmation, and, 2) emphasizes a spirit of penance. Through forty days of closer attention to God’s Word and of more fervent prayer, believers are prepared to celebrate the Paschal Mystery. Lenten instructions stress these baptismal and penitential themes.

The Church encourages penitential practices that are external and social, reflecting the circumstances of individuals and communities, as we pray and do penance for sinners.

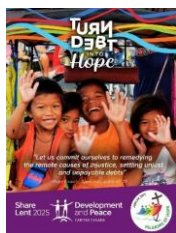

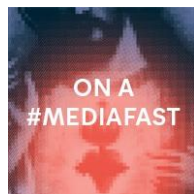
