

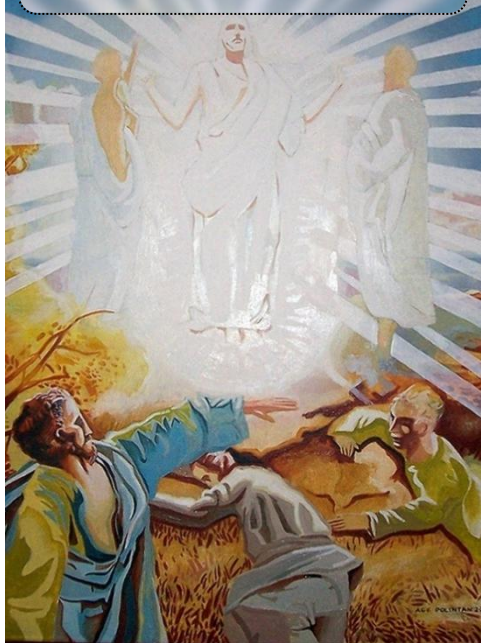

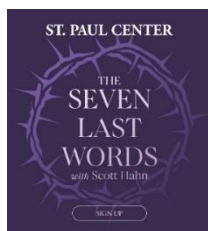

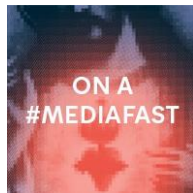

JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE

"Hope does not disappoint because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit" –Romans 5:5

From the Diocesan Invitation to live the Ordinary Jubilee of the Holy Year 2025

All members of the faithful are called upon to demonstrate a spirit of penitence, in particular by rediscovering the value of Friday as a day of fasting, abstinence and moderation in media distractions.

This Holy Year is an exceptional opportunity to renew our faith and hope, and to walk together as a pilgrim Church, united in prayer and charity.

1. What is an indulgence?

"An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints." "An indulgence is partial or plenary according as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin." Indulgences may be applied to the living or the dead. In our humanity, weak and attracted by evil, certain residual effects of sin remain. These are removed by the indulgence, always by the grace of Christ, who, as Saint Paul VI wrote, "is himself our 'indulgence'".

2. What is the Jubilee Indulgence?

The Jubilee Indulgence, thanks to the power of prayer, is intended in a particular way for those who have gone before us, so that they may obtain full mercy. It is a way of discovering the unlimited nature of God's mercy. All other Indulgences previously granted remain in force.

March 17 – **Saint Patrick**, Bishop, Missionary, the Apostle of Ireland, Patron of Ireland and Nigeria

March 18 – **Saint Cyril of Jerusalem**, Bishop, martyr, Greek Father of the Church, doctor of the Church, Cyril's instructions to catechumens are still source documents for the early teachings of the Church, fought Arianism

March 19 – **Saint Joseph**, husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Patron of the Universal Church and Principal Patron of Canada
